## EUROPEAN SAMPLER

### *Vacation Overview*

Start with two nights in London, where guided sightseeing includes a visit to St. Paul's Cathedral and the Changing of the Guard (if held). Board the Eurostar train to Brussels, followed by a comfortable drive to Amsterdam. Here, a leisurely canal cruise shows you the sights. In Germany, visit Cologne's impressive twin-spired gothic cathedral, take a cruise down the romantic Rhine River, spend the night in beautiful Heidelberg and travel through the Black Forest, home of the world's most famous cuckoo clocks. Cross the border into Switzerland and visit the thundering Rhine Falls before spending two nights in lakeside Lucerne. Continue on through breathtaking alpine scenery and the Burgundy wine region to Paris, where guided sightseeing includes all the highlights, as well as a ride up to the second floor of the Eiffel Tower.



## ITINERARY: OCTOBER 21-30, 2010

### Day 1

**Thursday** Board your overnight transatlantic flight.

### Day 2: Arrive in London

**Friday** Uniformed Globus hosts are available to help you make the most of your stay.

### Day 3: London

**Saturday** Morning sightseeing with a local guide includes all the famous landmarks: the Houses of Parliament and Big Ben beside the River Thames, Westminster Abbey, Whitehall's mounted horseguards and the prime minister's Downing Street residence, Piccadilly Circus, and Buckingham Palace. Highlights are a visit to St. Paul's Cathedral and the ceremonial pageantry of the Changing of the Guard, if held. Optional excursions are available to the Tower of London or Windsor Castle. (B)

### Day 4: London-Brussels, Amsterdam

**Sunday** Meet your tour director and traveling companions and head for the railway station to board the Eurostar train to Brussels, Belgium. From here, a comfortable drive will bring you to Amsterdam, the Netherlands' 700-year-old capital. Enjoy an orientation drive, including a canal cruise aboard a glass-roofed launch, which is the best way to get a good impression of how this city was built and how much still remains from the Golden Age. You may want to join an optional Dutch dinner with local specialties. (B)

### Day 5: Amsterdam-Cologne, Heidelberg

**Monday** This morning, drive past the Dutch region best known as the locale of "A Bridge Too Far" near Arnhem to Germany. In Cologne, visit the awesome twin-spired gothic cathedral, and then the afternoon's highlight: a romantic Rhine River cruise. Continue to Heidelberg and take pictures of the famous red-walled ruins of Heidelberg Castle. (B, D)

### Day 6: Heidelberg-Lucerne

**Tuesday** Morning stop in the lush valleys and pine-clad hills of the Black Forest, renowned for its cuckoo clocks. On the Swiss border, stop at the thundering Rhine Falls before continuing to picture-book Lucerne. Why not sign up for a folklore party with yodeling and alphorn blowing for a firsthand impression of Alpine merrymaking? (B)

### Day 7: Lucerne

**Wednesday** During your walking tour, admire Thorvaldsen's Lion Monument and the ornate patrician houses lining the cobbled streets of the walled Old Town, then cross the famous covered Chapel Bridge to the Jesuit Church. Balance of the day is at leisure to shop for Swiss watches and to choose from our optional activities: Climb a mountain by cable car or take a cruise on the fjord-like lake. (B, D)

### Day 8: Lucerne-Paris

**Thursday** Cross the Swiss border into France and enjoy a comfortable drive through the Burgundy wine region and past Fontainebleau Forest to Paris. (B)

### Day 9: Paris

**Friday** Discover the world capital of chic and style with a local guide and admire its most famous sights: the Opera, Arc de Triomphe, Champs-Élysées, Notre Dame Cathedral and more. For a bird's-eye view, take the elevator to the second floor of Paris' most famous landmark: the Eiffel Tower. An optional excursion to the lavish baroque Palace of Versailles is available. Tonight, a lively caberet show might just be the ticket. (B)

**Saturday** Your homebound flight from Paris arrives the same day. (B)
